Have a fun, safe and memorable Halloween 2015! Kent




RANDOM ACTS OF KINDNESS

New School News!

Welcome to the New School News. It will take many hands to prepare our new school site before moving next fall. There are numerous opportunities for parents and community members to get involved in this exciting project! We are excited to share with our school community what is happening!

The Building Development Committee was created to organize around the efforts. We have created subcommittees for volunteers to work on a specific aspect of the project. The sub-committees have chosen to communicate through a website called Basecamp. If you are not interested in the planning process, but want to help out when we are looking for volunteers, stay tuned! We will be posting updates in the newsletter, and on our website as the project moves along.

We would like to acknowledge Village School parent, Mike Magee, who has been donating a tremendous amount of time lending his professional expertise as an architect, and serving as the project manager.

Summary from last Building Development Committee Meeting on October 26th, 2015

The Committee worked on establishing a process to work together and to best communicate within the different committees and among the school community. The following process was proposed:

All active subcommittees are asked to report out at the regular bi-weekly building development committee meetings. They will mention highlights, decision points, anticipated costs, timelines, and pertinent next steps. The regular reporting from subcommittees can provide the basis for articles in the Village Voice, the "New School" page on the Village school website, and others.

Subcommittees are encouraged to get feedback from teachers, the best method to do this is to attend a teacher staff meeting on Thursdays, if possible. If that's not possible, ask a teacher to bring the inquiries to the staff meeting on behalf of the volunteer subcommittee.

Sub-Committee Reports

Grounds Planning Subcommittee:

The site survey should be completed soon and will provide details about locations of stormwater infrastructure and more. Mike Magee will share the survey with the committee as soon as it is available.

Moving Subcommittee:

There was agreement that we should get an estimate soon for the cost of hiring a professional moving company to move the school.

Buildings Subcommittee:

The teachers are working to come to agreement on what the base condition should be for each room. Once determined, the committee can get to work bringing all rooms up to this standard.

Teachers and administrators are actively discussing the placement of different classes and uses in different rooms. The building inspection report done in June will be made available to the sub-committee to determine the necessary repairs and upgrades.

Fundraising Sub-committee:

Andy Peara is planning a fundraising committee meeting for Thursday, November 5th at 5:30pm in the Staff Lounge. The VS Kitchen has launched a GoFundMe campaign to raise money for the new kitchen.

Transportation Sub-committee:

The City of Eugene will initiate a speed study for Willamette. This should take until approximately January to get results. The committe is going to work with the traffic engineer to explore the various options for crosswalks across Willamette and Donald. The committee is working with Safe Routes to Schools to create a walk/bike map that will be useful in planning and advocating for traffic calming in the area.

Kitchen Sub-committee:

Mike Magee has been working with kitchen staff and volunteers to draft the plan.
