

Watch Saturn Shine Tonight!

Dr. Dan Q. Posin, professor of astronomy, used to say, "The best thing about the moon is it is there." He inspired us to look toward the heavens. To have a cosmic perspective, recall our connection to the stars, take time to reflect and temporarily remove ourselves from the hardships of day to day work. Tonight take a moment to witness how Saturn shines.

Our solar system's "Lord of the Rings" will be at opposition starting the early morning hours of Friday, meaning it will align with Earth and the sun. This arrangement will provide amateur astronomers with one of their best opportunities this year to see the butterscotch beauty with the naked eye. The best time to look for it will be after midnight when it is highest in the night sky.

In our local universe, so many volunteers are doing an immense amount of work to help with our transition to the new school. Many have given up Saturdays and evenings and worked long hours. We are far from done. The work load is gigantic. This is a once in a lifetime event for our school.

Thanks for the help, now please take a breath, relax and reflect. Take a moment and gaze into the starry sky and enjoy what a cosmic perspective offers. Beginning this evening and through the summer Saturn is ours to behold with the naked eye.




Cozmic, also known as Whirled Pies Downtown, is located at 199 W 8th Avenue in Eugene. It is sure to be a fun farewell to a great school year!




A Kalapuya Elder and Her Daughter Visit
